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MANA MELE TO LAUNCH HAWAI'I'S FIRST SOLAR-POWERED MOBILE STUDIO

Kickstarter campaign to raise funds for the project

HONOLULU – Mana Maoli and the Music & Entertainment Learning Experience (MELE) program have teamed up to create an exciting Kickstarter campaign to fund its new Mana Mele Project – featuring a Music & Multimedia Academy and *Meleana*, Hawai'i's first solar-powered, mobile audio/visual studio that will serve as a state-of-the-art learning lab.

Geared towards empowering youth, *Mana Mele* offers an innovative solution to the nationwide crisis of decreased funding in music education and cultural preservation, and lack of college/career readiness among Hawai'i's youth. The studio will enable students to connect and work with youth and adults that share similiar passions for music and the profession, creating mentorships with local musicians, engineers, videographers and event planners. Students will be able to compose, record, and edit songs and music videos; produce audiobooks, instructional videos and other "knowledge resource products," along with stories and oral histories.

In addition, *Meleana* and the "*Mana Mele Collective*" will offer high-end live event services and studio products as a fee for service to businesses, individuals, nonprofits and schools. The *Mana Mele Collective* includes many of Hawai'i's finest music and multimedia industry professionals. The end goal of this initiative is to sustain Meleana's service to Hawai'i's youth and increase the scope and reach of Mana Mele's Academy curriculum. This aligns with Mana Mele's goals of advocating for excellence, clean energy, community and keiki.

As a recent example, Mana Mele joined forces with internationally renowned <u>Playing For Change</u> to record and film "Song Across Hawai'i" and "Song Around the World." The first song, "Hawai'i Aloha," features over three dozen of Hawai'i's top artists across many genres and more than 1,000 youth across 10 Mana Mele partner schools. It is scheduled for release at Mana Mele's launch event on April 22.

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Mana Mele's Kickstarter campaign will start on Tuesday, March 15, 2016 and run through Saturday, April 23, 2016. This campaign will allow for the launch of two exciting applications of *Meleana* and the Academy curriculum – a Mana Mele EP Series and 'ŌPIO TV. Mana Mele's EP series of quality music recordings will team popular local artists with Hawai'i's up-and-coming youth, allowing for a beautiful collaboration of the minds. Featured artists will include John Cruz, Henry Kapono, Brother Noland, The Green, Ledward Ka'apana, Mike Love, Paula Fuga, Kimie, Anuhea and many more.

'ŌPIO TV will encourage youth and communities to "tell *your* story, from *your* place." Youth will have the opportunity to cover stories that are of importance to them, while serving as news anchors, field reporters, and camera and sound crew.

A decade of fundraising, a three-year federal grant and support from Jack and Kim Johnson's 'Ohana Charitable Foundation allowed for the building of the mobile studio, design of the curriculum and the integration of both components across 10 partner schools and two school years. Now it is time to fundraise for the next phase.

"We're excited to kick-start Mana Mele's EP Series and 'ŌPIO TV! Meleana and our Academy curriculum provides an innovative platform to educate Hawai'i's 'ōpio using a unique, hands-on learning experience that brings together two worlds – modern technology and ancient knowledge," said Keola Nakanishi, Director, Mana Maoli. "Community support of this project will go a long way to help students grow and be college- and career- ready through music, movies and culture."

"I feel honored to be able to share my gift of music and have an exchange with the youth," said local musician and mentor Irie Love. "Being able to connect and teach them music through the Mana Mele project is a magical experience. I hope this project never ends."
