Kitty Yannone has over 30 years of experience in public relations, issues management and crisis communications. A well-known and respected Hawaii communicator, entrepreneur and community leader, Kitty was selected as the first “Businesswoman of the Year” by Pacific Business News (PBN). In 2017 she was named PBN’s “Women Who Mean Business Career Achievement” honoree.

Kitty is integrally involved in clients’ strategies and outcomes on a daily basis, working with the firm’s professionals internally and with clients directly. She is known for her tenacious dedication to achieving each client’s desired results and for handling some of Hawaii’s most challenging and controversial issues over the past 30 years. She is an active partner in IPREX, a global partnership of independent communications firms of which CommPac is the Hawaii affiliate, and has served on its 12-member Executive Committee.

Before joining CommPac, Kitty was a founding board member and the first executive director of Hawaii’s Ronald McDonald House. Later, she served as vice president of the Kapiolani Health Foundation. She currently chairs the boards of the American Red Cross-Hawaii State Chapter and Assets School. She has served on the boards of Bishop Museum, the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra and Diamond Head Theatre. She is a past president of the Rotary Club of Honolulu, Hawaii’s oldest and largest Rotary club.

Kitty served six years on the University of Hawaii Board of Regents, including two years as vice chair and two years as chair. She was recently honored as a University of Hawaii Distinguished Alumna.

In addition to having been honored as “Businesswoman of the Year,” Kitty also has been honored as one of Hawaii’s women leaders by the YWCA of Oahu. Other recognitions include: Junior Achievement of Hawaii Award by the Hawaii Business Hall of Fame; the Franklin Delano Roosevelt National Award for Distinguished Community Service by the Hawaii Chapter of the March of Dimes; and the Community Building Award by the Pacific Gateway Center. The American Red Cross-Hawaii State Chapter awarded her its Chairman’s Cup and The Mediation Center of the Pacific acknowledged her for her community leadership and mediation expertise.

Kitty has received numerous awards for her work from the Hawaii chapters of the Public Relations Society of America (PRSA) and the International Association of Business Communicators (IABC), and PRSA Hawaii honored her as the Gregg W. Perry Public Relations Professional of the Year in 2003.

She is a graduate of the University of Hawaii, with a degree in English Literature. Kitty was selected by Rap Reiplinger to perform in his comedy group, HATS, in 1982.
